Literature -

This course focuses on reading two novels throughout the year and meeting weekly to discuss ideas and literature concepts while learning alongside their peers. Students should schedule two 25-minute block for the reading assigned before class each week. Narration prompts are provided weekly, and students and parents can decide how often a composition should be completed based on their level. I recommend allowing at least one composition time in their schedule each week for writing. Also, a couple of projects are built into the course, which will require a little more time each week. Graded exams are included in the course, and compositions are optional and depend on the choice of the parent. See the fee breakdown below. For high school students, please email the instructor for credits for this course.

The course will have live weekly meetings on zoom for discussion. Class participation via discussion boards, assignments, and the schedule will all be assessed through Canvas platform. (which is free) Each student will need an email account to register. You can register using a parent's email account but they will need it to access the course. If registering with more than two children there will need to be two email accounts one for each student.

Supplies needed:

- Canvas account (information sent out during the summer- free)
- Documents printed (provided by Charlotte's Web - free)
- Book of Century book
- Commonplace book (notebook for quotes that stand out to the student)
- *Ivanhoe* by Walter Scott (Term 1-2)
- Modern 1900's novel (Term 3) TBD (Final selection to be chosen by June)

Pre-requisites: Grades 7-9* (Please make sure the literature selections are appropriate for your child in their development)
